#### A Few JOYCE Words:

In late March 1992, Don and I attended the 26th Senatorial District Convention held at the Leon Valley Community Center. Darby Riley, an old friend, was in charge. At the close of the meeting, Darby asked all of us what we thought of starting a Democratic organization in the northwest area and asked those of us who were interested to come up to the front and sign up. Don and I did and thus became charter members of what would be called "Northwest Democrats". Darby Riley would later become our first chair.

The group began meeting at Luby's on Bandera, just west of Loop 410 (it is no longer there). We chose to meet at 8:30 a.m. on Saturday mornings since that was when most of us were free to attend. In the spring of 1994, the group conducted a phone bank for Democratic candidates. Don and I attended when we could as we were busy running a campaign for a Democratic candidate for Attorney General in both the spring and fall.

By 1996, we became more active - something that Don continued until his death, and, still continues for me. Lloyd Phillips was the chair that year, and I was later asked to be the vice chair. I accepted and thus began a 20 year experience as an officer of the organization. It has been an incredible adventure. At my first executive committee meeting, we voted to establish our first dues and a small charge for meetings to pay for the breakfast Luby's served and a small amount to pay for our newsletters.

It was in 1996 that we started our first outreach of directly contacting voters with information about our candidates. We had no money, so we held a garage sale at the Morales' home in their yard and raised over \$900 to begin our work. Our first effort was to put together a door to door walk effort. We got walk lists from the Democratic Party, collected literature from as many candidates as would provide it to us, purchased plastic bags that we could hang on doors, and met at our home on Friday evenings to bag literature for delivery on Saturday morning. We divided the precinct lists into walk lists of about 150 houses and met in front of Luby's to begin our walks on Saturdays. By the time the election came in November, we had walked 25,000 houses.

In 1998, I was elected chair, and we repeated our walk efforts, delivering literature door to door, and watched our organization grow. We held our first Super Bowl in 1998, an activity we held every year till it was determined to discontinue it, beginning in 2017. I served as chair through 2002. We had our first office in 2000, when David Leibowitz offered us the opportunity to use an office he had on the access road of I-10. We have continued having an office each two years to provide this area of the city with information about our Democratic candidates.

#### A Few JOYCE Words continued:

Later we met to write our bylaws, deciding not to take sides as an organization in Democratic primaries, establishing our officers and their duties and terms, determined the boundaries where we would work and provide for elections every two years. Because we worked in the northwest area where Democrats were far outnumbered by Republicans, we decided to do more than engage in Democratic activities, but to also become part of the community. For many years we cleaned Eckhert Road once a quarter. We have community service projects almost every month. We no longer collect literature but began in 2008 to publish our own newspaper which contains short bios of every Democratic candidate in the county. We pay for the newspaper by taking ads from those candidates who wish to participate. We established the organization's official name as Northwest Democrats of Bexar County but are known as just Northwest Democrats.

One of our most successful activities has been our dinner each August to honor someone who served our community or our organization. The funds raised are used for our general election efforts each two years. Most of our elected officials attend as do many of our members. It is such an entertaining evening, and we all look forward to it each year.

From 2002-2006, Carrie Willborn served as our chair. I returned in 2006 and served until 2008. Jacob Middleton was elected in 2008 and has served continuously as chair through this December. I will go off the board this December, ending 20 continuous years of serving the organization in one capacity or another.

This March, Northwest Democrats will be 25 years old. This will be a very special year. Not many political organizations stay active for so long or work so hard for Democratic candidates. During these years we have watched the Democratic vote in our area grow. One candidate once told us that as he watches the votes come in on election night, he knew that Pct. 1 would come in Democratic; Precinct 3 would come in Republican; but he watched for the area in the northwest for that was the area that would put him over the top. You can't hope for a better reputation than that.
