In 1965, at the beginning of the legislative session, there was 1 Republican state representative. By the beginning of the 1969 session, there were 8 Republican state reps. Fast forward 10 years and there were 22 Republican state reps. Another 10 years and it's now 57. By 1999 it was up to 72, (Reminder, 76 is a majority in the State House). Two elections later, and Republicans had a majority with 88 seats. Remember that slow leak? Over 20 elections, Republicans went from 1 seat to 88 and a majority. Averaged out that's only 4 seats per election. It took them 20 elections and about 40 years, but they managed it. Slowly but surely. Isn't it amazing what a slow leak can do when left unchecked?

Not to digress, but Conservatives and Republicans have managed the same feat when it comes to policy. Why do you think there is legislation every session dealing with abortion, guns, gays, etc.? Republicans don't expect their grand scheme to pass on the first try. That's why you break it up into smaller legislative victories that no one sees coming until it's already happened. For example, how many times have Republicans restricted access to voting? One session it's shorter early voting times. Another session it's photo ID. They play the long game.
